3. **Target Areas**

In relation to current and expected scenarios, the initial focus areas of the LARC Study Group are:-

Assessing the uptake and spread of contractual elements in partnering.

Comparative review of the legal efficacy and ramifications of provisions for, and duties (or implied covenants) of good faith in ‘partnered’ and ‘allianced’ projects.

Comparative review of legal lessons learned from disputes in partnered contracts that used contractual forms such as PPC 2000, NEC, TCP 2005, IFOA, IPDA etc.
