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The content provided in this programme is very fruitful. The primary aims for Project Mingde are to provide support to the ethnic minority as well as to offer chances for students of Bachelor of Civil Engineering to put the knowledge into actual practice. This programme serves these purposes successfully, and I am delighted to be a team member in this programme, which I have gained a lot of practical working experience and culture of Guangxi citizens there.

In the first part of the programme, we were required to study the feasibility of relocating Faculty of Engineering and Faculty of Science to Kadoorie Centre in Shek Kong. Throughout this progress, I have practised the knowledge of surveying and structural design. As time provided for rendering the feasibility study report was very short, a proper division of labour has become paramount.

In the second part of the programme, we went to Guangxi for the field trip. We have travelled to different places and have inspected different projects, including some ongoing projects and some finished projects. Different from the first part of the programme, instead of investigating the feasibility of construction, I tried to learn from the contractors and workers regarding the techniques of construction and planning. Also, it is an excellent chance to allow students to refer the actual practice into their academic knowledge so that students could learn some new techniques and reinforce what they have learnt in their University studies at the same time.
