## Reflection on the trip to Guangxi (5<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> March 2016)

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The trip on 5-8 March was a fascinating experience to me. Then on the next day, we travelled to Daping Primary School to have in-depth discussion on the design of new teacher dormitory with the representatives from the school and the architects and the Guangxi University.
