Education is supposed to be enjoyable for students to learn new things. However, it goes astray in Hong Kong which is result-oriented and spoon-feeding. It is good to let children to learn more academic knowledge, but should it be achieved by sacrificing the childhood? This is the question we should all think of.

Speaking of improvement, I think the number of days of teaching can be extended ad 2 days of teaching is very limited for us to experience teaching. Besides, this summer camp needs to have a more thorough planning as there are many sudden incidents throughout the trip and there is no backup plan. Therefore, it is suggested to have better planning in order to secure the participants.
